



**ROGOW, Sally**

Sally Rogow has developed and directed a graduate program for B.C. teachers working with students who are blind, visually impaired and/or have multiple disabilities. Working with children led her to admire their courage, resulting in *Faces of Courage: Young Heroes of World War II*, an inspiring collection of 12 stories about teenagers in Europe who resisted the Nazis during World War II.

In addition to Rogow's dramatizations based on historical events and circumstances, she has published a monograph, *Hitler's Unwanted Children: The Story of Children with Disabilities in Nazi Germany* (1999). It appears in the *Journal of Holocaust Education*.

*They Must Not Be Forgotten: Heroic Catholic Priests and Nuns Who Saved People From The Holocaust* (Holy Fire Publishing, 2005 [www.christianpublish.com](http://www.christianpublish.com)) is Rogow's latest book, a compilation of true stories of rescue during World War II. The documented heroism of the priests and nuns whose stories are told have been recognized and honoured by the Yad Vashem and the Catholic church.

Rogow obtained a B.A. from the University of Wisconsin, an M.A. from Columbia University, and M.A. from Michigan State and an Ed.D. from University of British Columbia. She is now Professor Emerita of the Faculty of Education of the University of British Columbia
